Objective of the Workshop:

Understanding and putting fundamental financial management principles to use in our daily lives is what it means to be financially literate. It's a crucial life skill that directly affects our long-term well-



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being. Early exposure to the fundamentals of money management, saving, investing, etc., can help students develop the knowledge and abilities needed to make long-term, responsible decisions.

This workshop's objective was to help the young participants—students in classes 6,7,8, 9, and 10—develop fundamental knowledge and skills as well as help shape their financial attitudes and behaviors.

Topics Covered:

Apart from informing the participants about the educational aspect of financial literacy, the following topics were covered.

- 1. Basic Financial Concepts: Understanding money, sources of cash, interest received, and the time value of money.
- 2. Financial Planning: Learning budget planning, savings, compounding, and the importance of savings.
- 3. Banking and Transactions: Gaining knowledge about banks, savings accounts, UPI, plastic money, digital payments, and Internet banking.
- 4. Legal Documents and Identification: Understanding the significance of PAN and Aadhar cards.
- 5. Economic Factors: Learning about inflation and its impact.
- 6. Investments: Understanding the concepts of compounding, discounting, and insurance.
- **7.** Investment Basics: Gaining insight into Fixed deposits, Post office deposits, mutual funds, the stock market, shares, and the relationship between risk and return.

Discussion During the Workshop

Most of the participants were excited and had a good understanding of basic financial concepts like money, banks, PAN cards, and Aadhar cards. A few participants knew about digital transactions, but this knowledge wasn't as common. Many showed interest in learning more about concepts like the time value of money, inflation, and compounding. A few participants were also interested in learning about investments and insurance. Students in classes 9 and 10 were already aware of the stock market and mutual funds, mainly through advertisements and discussions with their families. This shows that young people are becoming more aware of financial topics, likely because of media and family influences.

Pedagogy:

The pedagogy involved delivering a lecture to establish fundamental knowledge, followed by a quiz to assess comprehension. To make the learning experience more engaging, we incorporated games and role-playing exercises to influence participants' attitudes and behaviors. Key details from the topics were summarized in charts, which were displayed in the classrooms for future reference. To encourage active participation, we offered gifts as incentives during the quizzes, which helped keep the students more engaged. The quizzes also served as a tool to check their understanding.

Insights:

This year, we introduced more advanced financial literacy topics, including mutual funds, risk management, and the stock market. The students responded quickly and demonstrated a better understanding of these concepts. These sessions were valuable for helping them grasp the basics of



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financial literacy and understand the importance of managing finances. The quick and positive response indicated that financial education is crucial. We believe that incorporating practical knowledge of finance in schools is essential to equip students with the necessary skills for their future.

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
